

To focus your search even tighter...

Turn the question into the answer. Rewrite the question in the form that the answer would take. Here's an example of a basic question (not an essential question!)

How old are kids in Taiwan when they can legally drive?

The answer might contain the words:

Teenagers

Driving age

can drive

are allowed to drive

legally drive

at the age of ...years old

when they are...years of age

There is no age limit

Remember the rule of 5: Searches should RARELY have more than 3-5 words.

The keywords I chose are

“driving age” Taiwan.

The first 3 hits tell me that the legal age is 18.

Use Quotation Marks to get rid of unnecessary hits. “Brad Pitt” with quotation marks will net you fewer hits, as searching without quotations marks will find hits for ALL Brads and every form of the word Pitt (peach pit, Pittsburgh, etc...)

Eliminate unnecessary hits by using NOT. For example, when studying about the Vikings and their historic battles, you don't want Minnesota Viking hits. **You would type:**

Vikings NOT football
